In the May/June issue of *Worldwide Challenge*, we are featuring Nations, Campus Crusade's ministry to Native American college students. The article "Middle Ground" tells the story of Nick Ross-Dick. Nick attends college at Montana State University and became a Christian through Nations. The state of Montana is home to seven reservations and 11 different Indian tribes. Originally hesitant to accept Christ, Nick now co-leads the Nations ministry on his campus. "Christianity: it's the white man's. It's their thing. Like, 'Here comes another missionary to save the savages from demonic ways,'" says Nick, recalling how he felt about Christianity his freshman year. Then one night after attending a Nations meeting, Nick read the Bible and it changed from a book of rules to a story of healing. "It made sense all of a sudden," Nick said. He now lives in the middle ground of being Native American and a Christian. Please pray for Nick as he tells his family and peers about the truth of Christ.
