Mission Focus

Dave & Carol Richards (NC) - The Richards are thankful for their prayer partners and for God's ongoing faithfulness. They have heard both good and bad news from the ministry in Mali. New wells are being drilled for the churches, which opens doors to share the gospel. VBS this year had one day with a high attendance of 335 young people, and 117 answered the call to follow Jesus during the invitation! Unfortunately, tensions are still high between the Songay blacks and the Arabs, which has led to fighting, and five hundred people have been forced to flee. Pray for the people and the church there!

Eddie & Nancy Wang (CFC-NC) - Eddie's health continues to improve, and he is working to write down notes from lessons that he taught years ago in hopes that it will benefit young preachers and Christians. The Coronavirus has caused over 33 million people in China to be quarantined, prompted China-US flights to be suspended, and forced cancellation of the 2T Pastors and Christian Educators trainings this year. Instead, they are planning a conference at the end of the year to promote the 2021 trainings and prepare for the International conference of Chinese Fundamentalist Christians 2021. With the Chinese government focused on dealing with the health crisis, their serious persecution of the house churches may lessen; however, it will not cease until the national leaders turn to Christ. Pray for China.

Annette Williams (ABWE-KY) - Annette officially began her retirement on January 1, but she will still be ministering in missions. She will continue to serve with the ABWE International Healthcare ministries team (IHM), of which she has been a part since it began in 2002. They are a lifeline to missionaries around the world in areas of personal health as well as strategizing. Her role will involve travel in the U.S. and internationally. She is also working to set up her home here in the U.S., as she left nearly everything in Togo, and to deal with the medical expenses from her recent surgery. Pray for her as she transitions to living and ministering stateside.
